FROM THE PASTOR

There is a card that I have had on the mirror of my dresser for years. I don't even know where it came from to be honest, but for years, maybe even a decade or more it has been there. Printed in large, green, bold letters is the word JOY. Entangled all around and through the word – JOY-- are vines, flowers and bunches of grapes ready to burst, all rendered in a golden shimmering relief. It is lovely.

JOY, it proclaims to me day after day, each morning when I awake.

Though it is lovely, and though I am happy to have it adorning my mirror, I must confess that days, weeks and months can go by without me even really seeing it let alone hearing its proclamation. Familiarity breeds, if not contempt, at least indifference.

We have just come through Holy Week, the capstone to that great walk with Jesus that opened to us back on that first Sunday in December when we celebrated the beginning of Advent with the Hanging of the Greens. But even though it has been a rich and

wonder-filled walk from Christmas to Easter, even though the trumpet of Easter may still resound in the sanctuary, and the sweet smell of lilies may linger still, I wonder, have we really taken it in or have we simply moved on with the scroll of the calendar?

I wonder has the JOY that is to be at the heart of our faith become something so familiar that we no longer really feel it? Has Easter's JOY become a platitude that we now so easily overlook?

Is this story just that-- a story that we tell each year in church about something that happened long ago; a story disconnected from our living now? I fear it can be unless we really take the time each day to ask how is it that this story of love made manifest in the person of Jesus who touched and healed and made whole so many lives, who the powers and principalities of the day could not tolerate, who was brutally killed as a peace offering to an empire, whose body was washed in tears by the women who refused to be moved, whose living presence sparked and sparks "unspeakable joy"

from all who live on the far side of the empty tomb – how is *that* story *our* story?

To live in JOY is, I believe, to live a countercultural life, gospel informed, Jesus-led life. Living in JOY does not mean we live in denial. It does not mean that we turn from the hurt in the world and pretend it does not exist. Nor does it mean that our lives will be free from pain or suffering. After all we just came through Holy Week, for God's sake!

What it does mean is that as real as the brokenness, hurt and suffering of this world is; as mean as violence and hatred is; as hard as living can be sometimes, even most of the time, God is. God's love is so tenacious that the worst of humanity cannot unhinge the best that is God. And that should and does bring JOY! If only we take the time to see and step into it each day.

May Easter's JOY be ours yearround — Stacy

Exploring Sacred Spaces: Day Trip to the Boston College Labyrinth and Episcopal Monastery in Cambridge Sunday, April 28, noon to 5:30 p.m.

The Waban Health Nursing and Rehabilitation Center: Taking Worship Beyond Our Sanctuary's Walls






