Featuring Rabbi David Menachem, a rising star in the revival of piyyutim (Jewish liturgical poems) in Israel; Lubna Saleme, a featured vocalist with Nazareth Orchestra; and Mohammed Gaddir, a 14-year-old Bedouin singer, Diwan Saz performs traditional Middle Eastern music from many traditions.
